STATE NEWS

Libertarian candidate for Governor of Indiana Donald Rainwater carried a district, Brown County's Jackson Township Precinct 2, with a majority of the vote in a three-candidate race against a Democrat and a Republican.

It is extremely unusual for a Libertarian to carry a district in a major three-party election. Two decades ago Kamal Jain, Massachusetts Libertarian party candidate for State Auditor, carried the town of Hawley, Massachusetts, beating the incumbent State Auditor and an independent. This was the first time in living memory that a Massachusetts LP candidate for statewide office finished first in a city or town.

Particularly noteworthy is the election victory of former Libertarian National Committee member Aaron Starr to the Oxnard City Council. Oxnard has over 200,000 residents. He defeated an incumbent. Two other challengers were successful. Starr has run for the post repeatedly, but this time he won decisively. Starr and friends may have a Council majority.

FEDERAL NEWS

The Liberal Party of the United States recently held its first national event and elected officers for two-year terms ending in 2026. The officers are Trisha Butler of Tennessee, Chair, Chris Luchini of New Mexico, Treasurer, and Apollo Pazell, Secretary.

The new Liberal Party Executive Director is Tim Ferreira.

Elimination of the death penalty has long been an objective of the Libertarian Party. President Joseph Biden has pardoned 37 of the 40 people on Federal Death Row, thus moving the Federal government much closer to not using the death penalty.

The three persons who were not pardoned were convicted for involvement in killing nine members of Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, killing three people in the 2013 Boston Marathon bombing, and killing eleven congregants of the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh.

Around the world, pro-freedom parties are on the rise. In Germany the classical liberal party is the Party of Reason. Europe has national and pan-European political parties, the latter to contest seats in the European Parliament. The Party of Reason, the French Liberal Democratic Party, the Netherlands' Libertarian Party, and the Spanish Spain Party of Individual Freedom have jointly formed the European Party for Individual Liberty.

The attention of readers is drawn to the book *Why Nations Fail* by Daron Acemoglu and James Robinson. They provide a fundamental advance, critical to the success of pro-freedom movements, over the free-market economic interpretation of the Austrian School of economics.

In essence, there are two sorts of social organizations, inclusive and extractive. An inclusive organization seeks to include as many people as possible in the benefits of the organization. An extractive organization seeks to take advantage of the many for the benefit of the few.

However, there are also two sorts of organization, economic and political. An inclusive economic organization is run by some semblance of the rule of law and free-market economics. An extractive political organization is the local dictator and his kleptocrat friends.

The important advance of Acemoglu and Robinson is that a free society requires inclusive politics or its economy will eventually become extractive. Furthermore, moving toward an inclusive economy does not necessarily cause you to move toward inclusive politics. The two motions are somewhat independent, and you need both.
